## Facilities Engineering: Management of Natural Resources

### Forest Product Sales

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**Summary.** This regulation sets forth policy and procedures for obtaining firewood and other forest products from the Fort Gordon Military Installation. It also assigns responsibilities to ensure an effective program for the optimum use of forest resources through utilization of scientific forest management techniques.

**Applicability.** This regulation applies to all individuals (military and civilians) who engage in obtaining small volumes of forest products on Fort Gordon for personal use.

**Supplementation.** Supplementation of this regulation is prohibited unless specifically approved by the Garrison Commander, USACCoE&FG, Fort Gordon, GA 30905-5000.

**Suggested improvements.** The proponent of this regulation is the Directorate of Public Works (DPW), Natural Resources Branch (NRB). 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## **CHAPTER 1**

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### **1.1 Purpose.**

This regulation establishes responsibilities and policies for obtaining firewood, pine straw, and other forest products on Fort Gordon Military Installation. Forest products include but are not limited to: dead and down wood (i.e. firewood), pine straw, mulch, pine boughs, pinecones, tree seeds (acorns, pecans, etc.), berries, mushrooms, etc. Violation of this regulation is punitive.

#### **1-2 General.**

All harvesting of small volume forest products on the Fort Gordon military installation will be in accordance with Army Regulation (AR) 405-90 and AR 200-1. Sales agreements (permits) for individuals to remove forest products will be as prescribed in AR 405-80. Forest products are considered real property of the Department of the Army and installation permits are required to harvest all forest products on Fort Gordon. The DPW - NRB develops management plans, establishes forest products permits and regulation updates, and conducts land management. The Fort Gordon iSportsman website will display the most current and accurate information and violations of this regulation will be based on the information posted on the Fort Gordon iSportsman website. Harvesters of forest products will take time to familiarize themselves with this regulation.

#### **1-3 References.**

Required and related publications, and prescribed and referenced forms are listed in Appendix A.

#### **1-4 Responsibilities.**

a. The DPW - NRB will be responsible for:

(1) Determining the availability of and making available for harvest small volumes of forest products, in accordance with the appropriate regulations.

(2) Setting the cost and terms of the permit(s) based on the value of the forest product(s) to be harvested and other factors such as the cost of program administration.

(3) Procuring, processing, and issuing all installation forest product harvesting permits IAW this regulation.

(4) Development, maintenance, and administration of the iSportsman system and its related content.

(5) Updating training area availability in the iSportsman system in the event DPTMS Range Control is unable to perform this function.

(6) Following established procedures for collecting funds and submitting proper reports/forms to the Defense Accounting Officer.

(7) The development and maintenance of training area information stations, maps, and this regulation.

(8) Issuance of the Fort Gordon Training Area Parking Pass (Chap. 8, Fig. 2) for forest products harvesting.

(9) Ensuring that a copy of this regulation is available to each individual obtaining any Fort Gordon forest products harvesting permit.

b. The DPTMS will be responsible for:

(1) Directing which training areas are closed to forest products harvesting due to military mission and/or safety reasons. Updating training area availability for recreational activities in the Fort Gordon iSportsman system daily.

(2) Producing a schedule of training areas available for recreational use that will be issued to DES and NRB personnel, as needed.

(3) The control, coordination, and monitoring for all activities conducted within the installation training complex to ensure safety and unified operations.

(4) Implementing DA Pamphlet 385-63 and USACCoE&FG Reg 350-19 to approve, control, and monitor user access into the installation training area complex for military training, administrative or other activities not covered by this regulation. Range Control will be included in all training area complex scheduling activities.

(5) Provide input to DPW NRB regarding USACCoE&FG Reg 420-3 to ensure compliance with USACCoE&FG Reg 350-19.

c. The DES will be responsible for:

(1) Enforcing all laws pertaining to natural, cultural, and archaeological resources, environmental law, and Security Protective Force laws on Fort Gordon. This includes enforcing regulations pertaining to environmental pollution, endangered species and wetlands protection, illegal access, illegal dumping, archaeological and historic protection, etc. The DES is responsible for law enforcement to include the processing and disposition of all individuals who violate this forest products harvesting regulation or any relevant environmental laws and regulations. Installation Conservation

Law Enforcement Officers (CLEO) and Military Police (MP) may cite, suspend, and/or apprehend Military Service Members and civilians for violations of federal and state laws, Fort Gordon regulations, or the UCMJ. Violators may face prosecution under federal law or the UCMJ, as well as adverse administrative action. Privileges of those individuals who receive a citation may be suspended, revoked, and/or fined. See Chapter 6 and Chapter 8 Figure 3 of this regulation for more specific information about violations to this regulation.

(2) Providing law enforcement to ensure that only authorized points of entry (such as Gates 1, 5 and 6) into the installation are being used by individuals who are harvesting minor forest products and reporting probable unauthorized entry points to DPW- NRB for repair and maintenance.

(3) Assist in posting informational updates or notices at each of the TA Recreation Information Stations.

(4) Accessing the Fort Gordon iSportsman system to ensure compliance with check in/out procedures, check the status of users (validate permit status, training area access, etc.), and to clear training areas of users daily to ensure all recreationists are accounted for.

(5) Maintaining permanent files listing the name, type of offense, and the "from/through" dates of suspensions or the effective date the privilege was revoked. Providing and updating, as required, a listing of those individuals who are under suspension or have had their installation hunting, fishing and/or harvesting privilege revoked or reinstated to the DPW - NRB and Garrison Commander.

(6) Development and enforcement of access to the installation. Control access to the installation and length of time access is granted through the issue of access passes via the Visitor Control Center (VCC) at Gate 6.

d. All individuals authorized and desiring to harvest forest products are responsible for:

(1) Creating an account and maintaining up to date account details (local address, emergency contact, email, etc) and contact information on Fort Gordon's iSportsman system, via <https://ftgordon.isportsman.net/>.

(2) Familiarizing themselves with this regulation. Purchase of permit implies that the permittee has read, understands, and agrees to all conditions of the permit and this regulation. Observed violations of laws and this regulation may be reported telephonically to the MP desk, 706-791-4380.

(3) Obeying all guidance for removing forest products contained in this regulation and the sales agreement.

(4) Ensuring that they have a valid forest products harvesting permit before removing any forest products.

## **CHAPTER 2**

### **AUTHORIZATION AND ACCESS**

#### **2-1 Individuals Authorized to Harvest Forest Products**

a. Any member of the general public who can legally access the installation is eligible to purchase a forest products harvesting permit for the removal of forest products. Individuals without a DoD ID will have to obtain a pass at the VCC at Gate 6.

#### **2-2 Access to Fort Gordon Training Area Complex.**

a. All individuals harvesting forest products in the Fort Gordon Training Area Complex must utilize the Fort Gordon iSportsman system to obtain permits and determine which training areas are available for use (training areas status will be updated in the Fort Gordon iSportsman system daily). Users will check in using the Fort Gordon iSportsman system according to this regulation.

b. Individuals harvesting forest products must obtain a Fort Gordon Training Area Parking Pass (Chap. 8, Fig. 2) to enter and/or park a vehicle in any training area. Parking passes can be printed from the Fort Gordon iSportsman website by the user or obtained from the Natural Resources Branch Field Office (Bldg 403, Forestry Rd.) during normal duty hours. Once a pass is obtained the individual must also check in/out of the training areas using the Fort Gordon iSportsman system.

c. Individuals driving their POV (as defined in USACCoE&FG Regulation 210-3) through the training area complex who remain on paved surface roads without entering a training area or those utilizing the Leitner Lake Recreation Area do not require a parking pass and are not required to check in. POVs are not authorized to pass over, through, or around a closed gate, cable, sign, earth berm, or other structure or device intended to prevent access to an area or roadway.

d. Individuals harvesting forest products in the cantonment area of Fort Gordon must also obtain a forest products permit and check in to the cantonment area via iSportsman. Cantonment is the area around main post that does not fall into a specific training area and is detailed in Chap. 8, Fig. 6. Only small forest products may be harvested in cantonment. Harvesting of firewood, pine straw, and mulch is prohibited in the cantonment area. A training area parking pass is recommended but not required. It is the individual's responsibility to follow signage and/or use common sense and situational awareness to avoid entering restricted, fenced off, or closed areas of cantonment.

## CHAPTER 3

### PERMITS AND FEES

#### 3-1 Permits.

a. Fort Gordon Forest Products Harvesting Permits are required to collect or harvest forest products on Fort Gordon. There are two separate annual permits: one that allows for the collection/harvest of small forest products including but not limited to berries, fiddleheads, tree nuts (acorns, pecans), pinecones, pine boughs, and mushrooms; and one that allows for the collection/harvest of firewood, pine straw, fat lighter, and mulch as well as the small forest products listed above. Forest Products Harvesting Permits are available for purchase through the Fort Gordon iSportsman website (<https://ftgordon.isportsman.net>). The Fort Gordon NRB makes no guarantee as to the quantity and/or quality of the forest products made available for harvest.

b. All permits are valid for 12 months from the date of purchase.

c. The permit is non-refundable and non-transferable.

d. Anyone assisting a Forest Product Harvester must either have a valid Fort Gordon Outdoor Recreation permit (also available through the Fort Gordon iSportsman website), their own Forest Products permit, or be checked in as a guest.

e. All persons must read and affirm by check box a Release and Hold Harmless Agreement available on the iSportsman site during the registration and permit purchasing process. No permits will be issued through the iSportsman system until this has been completed.

#### 3-2 Installation Training Area Safety Brief.

Individuals wishing to enter Fort Gordon for any forest product harvesting must read/watch a safety brief and take a corresponding quiz located on the Fort Gordon iSportsman website annually. Upon successful completion of the safety brief and quiz the individual's iSportsman account will be annotated accordingly to serve as proof of completion. All safety brief validations expire on 15 June and must be retaken after this date.

#### 3-3 Fees.

Chapter 8, Figure 1 lists the current installation forest products harvesting permit fees. Note that installation forest products harvesting permit fees are subject to change at any time.



## **CHAPTER 4**

### **VEHICLES**

#### **4-1 Use of POVs when Harvesting Forest Products**

a. Users may only travel primary access roads to reach training areas where they are checked in to harvest forest products. Primary access roads are those designated on the current Hunting and Fishing Resources Map produced by the Fort Gordon DPW - NRB and posted at all training area recreation information stations and on the Fort Gordon iSportsman website. Primary access roads are also multiple use roads for other activities such as military training, government, construction, logging, etc. Driving on limited access roads and firebreaks is not authorized unless individuals are checked in for that training area.

b. POVs will not traverse cross-country, through reforested areas, or planted wildlife openings. At no time are POVs allowed to operate/ride off established roads or firebreaks.

c. When harvesting forest products, POVs must be parked in the training area the individual is checked in to.

d. POVs are not allowed to operate on roads or firebreaks that have been marked closed.

e. Blocking firebreaks or roads to traffic is prohibited. Parking parallel to or just off of firebreaks is permitted.

f. It is prohibited to walk/enter, ride or drive a POV over, through, or around a closed gate, cable, sign, earth berm, or other structure or device intended to prevent access to an area or roadway.

g. No POVs, dirt bikes, three- or four-wheeled all-terrain vehicles (ATV), or other motorized off-road vehicles are authorized on any range, in any training area, or on dirt roads except as outlined in Chapter 4 and 5-1b. and as indicated in USACCoE&FG Reg 350-19.

h. Vehicles are subject to search by DES Conservation Law Enforcement Officers, MPs, and other authorized personnel upon entering, occupying, or exiting training areas if there is probable cause to believe that a violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, DA regulations, USACCoE&FG regulations, State law, or Federal law has occurred.

i. Vehicles located in training areas are subject to an unannounced inspection when the inspection is IAW FM 19-10, Chapter 9. A Fort Gordon training area parking pass

(Chap. 8, Fig. 2) must be displayed on the driver-side dash of the vehicle while harvesting forest products in the training areas. Parking passes can be obtained through the Fort Gordon iSportsman website homepage or the Natural Resources Branch Field Office (Bldg 403, Forestry Rd.) during normal duty hours.

j. The only person allowed to transport forest products is the Forest Product Harvesting Permit holder in a registered haul vehicle. Only one vehicle designated as a haul vehicle may be used at a time per permit; a trailer attached to the permitted vehicle is allowed (i.e. assistants are not allowed to drive additional haul vehicles at the same time). If assistants are driving their own vehicle, they may not place forest products in their vehicle unless they also possess a Forest Products Harvesting permit.

k. Electric bikes are an approved method of transportation to access harvesting locations but must be used IAW USACCoE&FG Reg 210-3. Electric bikes used for transportation within a training area must follow the same guidelines as the POVs outlined in this regulation (i.e. no driving cross country, no blocking firebreaks, etc). Electric bikes parked in the training areas must have a visibly displayed Fort Gordon Training Area Parking Pass.

## **CHAPTER 5**

### **FOREST PRODUCTS HARVESTING**

Forest products include any natural material found in the forest. These products include but are not limited to dead and downed trees (firewood), pine boughs, pinecones, tree seeds (pecans, acorns, etc.), flowers, mushrooms, berries, fiddleheads, mulch, fat lighter and pine straw.

#### **5-1 Harvesting Areas and POV Access**

a. Forest Products harvesting areas are established by the Fort Gordon Natural Resources Branch and posted at the Training Area Recreation Information Stations and on the Fort Gordon iSportsman website. These areas could include training areas, cantonment areas, or product-specific designated areas. Harvesting areas are subject to change. All harvesters should check the maps posted on the Fort Gordon iSportsman page or the training area recreation stations for the most up to date harvest areas.

b. Individuals participating in any harvesting of forest products may only travel primary access roads, as identified on the current Hunting and Fishing Resource map (posted at the training area recreation information stations and on the Fort Gordon iSportsman website – “Maps” drop-down section), to reach training areas where they are checked in to harvest. Once harvesters enter their training area, they are allowed to use any open road or firebreak within that area. Harvesters are not permitted to travel through training areas they are not checked in to, except for entering TA 49A to access TA 49B and entering TA 46 to access TA 47.

c. Only one training area can be checked into for harvesting forest products at any one time.

## **5-2 Checking In and Out.**

a. All persons, regardless of age, entering any open training area for harvesting forest products are required to check in by utilizing the Fort Gordon iSportsman system prior to entering the area. Forest Products Harvesting permits must be obtained prior to check-in. See Chapter 3 for permit information.

All individuals under the age of 18 are not required to have a permit but must be checked in as a guest under a properly permitted sponsor who is 18 years old or older and must be accompanied by that sponsor at all times.

b. Anyone assisting a Forest Products Permit holder that does not possess their own Forest Products Permit or Outdoor Recreation permit must be checked in as a guest in iSportsman under a properly permitted sponsor and must be accompanied by that sponsor at all times. Permitted sponsors can check-in up to two guests at a time.

c. All users are required to check out upon completion of harvesting by utilizing the Fort Gordon iSportsman system. Guests will be automatically checked out at the same time as their sponsor checks out.

d. Each visit to a training area requires checking in and out. This includes multiple visits to the same area on the same day.

e. All harvesters are advised to read all notices and updates posted at the training area recreation information stations or on the Fort Gordon iSportsman website prior to commencing activity.

f. Users may not use another person's login credentials to check that user into or out of an area.

g. During the checkout procedure on iSportsman, all harvesters must report the type and estimated quantity of harvest by selecting the appropriate forest product and filling out the associated form.

## **5-3 Legal Hours.**

a. Individuals may check in to an open training area to harvest forest products no earlier than official sunrise.

b. Legal hours for harvesting forest products are from official sunrise to official sunset. Harvesters must be checked out by official sunset.

c. Harvesting of forest products is permitted 7 days a week in training areas open for harvesting, except on Christmas Day.

#### **5-4 General Regulations.**

a. Forest products can be harvested in any training area that is open for recreation in iSportsman with a valid Forest Products Harvesting permit. Only small forest products (pecans, fiddleheads, berries, etc.) can be harvested in the cantonment area. No firewood, pine straw, or mulch will be harvested or collected in the cantonment area.

b. Only dead and down (on the ground) trees are allowed to be harvested with a Forest Products Harvesting permit. Standing and/or leaning trees (dead or alive) may not be cut down for firewood unless approved by NRB.

c. Persons engaging in the use of a chainsaw must wear appropriate personal protective equipment. Persons utilizing chainsaws or power tools for the harvesting of forest products will do so at their own risk.

d. All individuals entering training areas during firearms hunting seasons regardless of activity must wear outer garments always totaling at least 500 square inches of daylight fluorescent orange or pink while within a training area. This clothing must be worn above the waistline (and may include a head covering) while in the training areas. Fluorescent orange/pink outer garments are recommended but are not required in archery/crossbow hunting areas (TAs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14A, 15, 16, and 17). Firearms hunting seasons occur annually from October to March. Exact dates are posted on iSportsman.

e. Dud Areas: Individuals will not enter any marked or known dud area for any reason. If a dud is found outside a marked or known dud area, **DO NOT DISTURB**. Mark the area and report the location to Range Control or the Law Enforcement Center (706-791-4380) as soon as possible. It is the Harvester's responsibility to familiarize themselves with "Dud Area" boundaries and adhere to policies regarding "Dud Areas".

#### **5-5 Restrictions.**

a. The cutting of live trees for any reason is prohibited. Firewood should be harvested from dead and downed trees only (unless approved by Fort Gordon NRB).

b. Forest products obtained from Fort Gordon under a Forest Products permit may not be traded, bartered, or sold.

c. Entry is prohibited in the area known as the "Artillery Impact Area" by unauthorized personnel. Harvesting forest products in this area is prohibited at all times. This area is bounded on the north, south, east, and west by a posted firebreak as well as Ivy Road on the north, Brier Creek on the south, and Harlem Road and Boggy Gut Creek on the east.

d. Harvesting of forest products is prohibited in posted "Dud Areas" and on those ranges posted "RESTRICTED" for safety reasons.

e. All Fort Gordon Training Areas will be closed to all forest products harvesting on Christmas day. Areas will be open to these activities on all other holidays.

f. Littering or dumping is prohibited. The offender will be cited to appear before the U.S. Magistrate or apprehended.

g. Digging is prohibited on Fort Gordon in the training areas.

## **5-6 Alcohol and Drugs.**

Individuals will not be intoxicated, possess alcohol on their person, or consume alcoholic beverages while harvesting forest products. Individuals will not be under the influence of illegal drugs or possess them while harvesting forest products. Individuals will not be under the influence of prescription drugs that do not allow the operation of a motor vehicle.

## **CHAPTER 6 Violations and Penalties**

### **6-1 Violations.**

a. Individuals who violate Department of the Army Regulations and/or the provisions of this regulation may be cited for the violation and may have their privilege withdrawn for a specific time (suspended) or withdrawn permanently (revoked) and/or fined. All privileges pertaining to harvesting forest products on the installation are withdrawn from the individual at this time. See 6-1 c below. The individual will have an administrative hold placed on their account in iSportsman and will not be allowed to check in to any activities.

b. If privileges are withdrawn, the suspension period begins on the day the violation occurred. Suspension periods for two violations are to run concurrently if the citations were written on the same day. Individuals who have committed three violations on the same day may have their privilege revoked. Individuals harvesting forest products during a suspension period will have their privilege revoked.

c. Individuals who have had their privileges to harvest forest products suspended or revoked may not enter any training area and may not participate in any forest products harvesting, training area recreation, hunting, or fishing. Individuals suspended or revoked may use the Leitner Lake camping facilities or the Tactical Advantage Sportsman's Complex (Range 14).

d. Upon the first failure to check out, individuals may receive up to a 14-day

suspension, however, two failures to check out within a six (6) month period may result in a 3-month suspension of privileges.

e. Sponsors of guests who commit a violation will lose their privilege an equal amount of time as their participant or guest.

f. Individuals who have their privileges suspended may request that their privileges be reinstated at the end of the suspension period by contacting the DES – CLEO. At this time the administrative hold in iSportsman can be removed from the individual's account.

g. The DES – CLEO will provide and update as required a listing of those individuals who are under suspension or have had their installation forest products harvesting and/or training area recreation privileges revoked to DPW – NRB and the Garrison Commander.

h. The DES – CLEO will maintain permanent files listing the name, type of offense, and the "from/through" dates of suspensions or the effective date the privilege was revoked.

i. The privilege to harvest forest products on the installation will be immediately restored should the individual be found not guilty of the violation as recorded on the citation after the court case has been adjudicated by the US Magistrate. The individual must show proof of a not guilty finding or ruling for return of the permit(s) (reinstatement) to DES - CLEO personnel who will then remove the administrative hold on the person's iSportsman account.

## **6-2 Appeals.**

a. Persons who have had their privilege to harvest forest products on the installation suspended or revoked on Fort Gordon Recreation Suspension/Revocation Notice (FG Form 9170) (Chap. 8, Fig. 5) may request reinstatement of their privileges. Requests from active duty military shall be submitted in writing through their chain of command, through the DES, to the Garrison Commander. Retired military, government employees, civilians, contractors, and family members shall submit their requests, in writing, through the DES to the Garrison Commander. If the request for reinstatement of privileges is denied, reinstatement may be requested again every two years thereafter.

b. The DES - CLEO will provide a letter to the DPW - NRB for each person who has had his/her privilege reinstated granting permission to remove the administrative hold on the individual's iSportsman account.

**6-3 Suspensions and Revocations.** Chapter 8, Figures 3 & 4, list violations and other provisions of this regulation for which user privileges are suspended or revoked.

## **CHAPTER 7**

### **Miscellaneous**

**7-1 Hunting, Fishing, and Training Area Recreation.** Hunting, fishing, bicycle riding, and other outdoor recreation without proper permits is prohibited. See the Fort Gordon iSportsman website and Fort Gordon USACCoE&FG Reg. 420-5, for requirements to conduct these activities. Anyone who conducts these activities must have an appropriate permit which can be purchased from the Fort Gordon iSportsman website.

**7-2 Endangered and Threatened Species.** In accordance with AR 200-1, it is unlawful for any person subject to the jurisdiction of the U.S. to harass, harm, or capture any endangered or threatened species within the U.S.

a. Firewood harvesting within 200 feet of any known or marked Red-cockaded woodpecker (*Dryobates borealis*) cavity tree is not allowed. Other forest products harvesting is allowed within 200 feet of any known or marked RCW cavity tree but caution should be taken to avoid major disturbances. These trees are marked with either two 5-inch white bands or one single green band approximately 4 feet above the ground.

b. Disturbing a Gopher Tortoise (*Gopherus polyphemus*) or its burrow is prohibited. No vehicle traffic is allowed within 25 feet of a burrow unless on improved roads. No foot traffic is allowed within 5 feet of a burrow.

**7-3 Cultural Resources.** In accordance with AR 200-1, it is unlawful to disturb archaeological sites or remove artifacts from Fort Gordon. The use of metal detectors on Fort Gordon is prohibited in training areas. No digging is allowed in the training areas of Fort Gordon.

**7-4 Military Training.** Military training events within the training area complex such as artillery firing, live fire exercises, range use, aerial gunnery, and other military field training area use will close all occupied training areas for recreational use. Range Control will designate areas that will be "OFF LIMITS" for harvesting forest products. These "OFF LIMITS" areas will be posted daily in iSportsman.

#### **VIOLATIONS OR OFFENSES FOR WHICH PRIVILEGES ARE PERMANENTLY REVOKED**

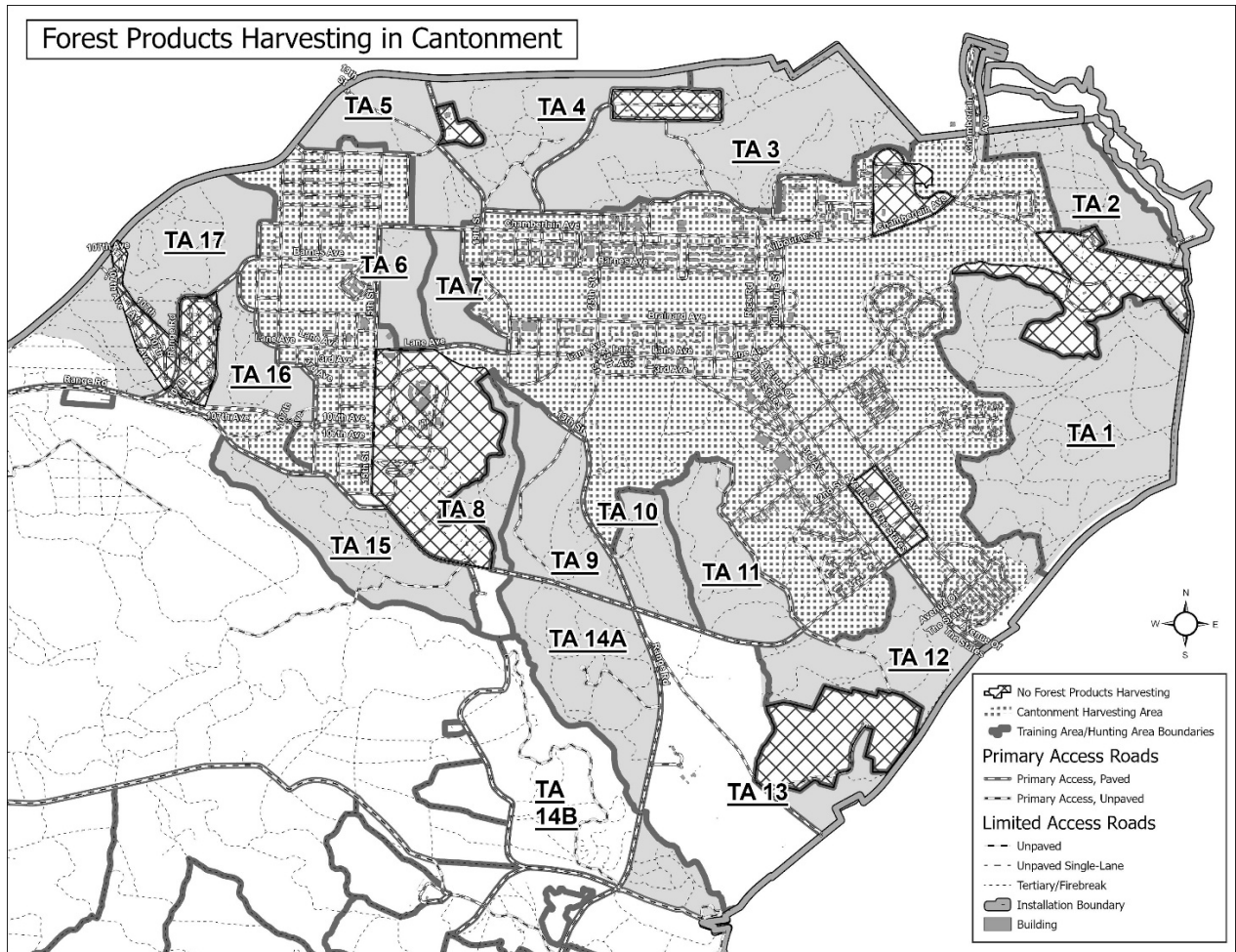
The following offenses require mandatory revocation of post privileges. (All revocations are on a permanent basis)

1. Participating in harvesting of forest products in unauthorized areas of the installation cantonment area.
2. Participating in harvesting of forest products in the Artillery Impact Area.
3. Failure to consent to inspection of POV by DES MPs, Conservation Law Enforcement Officers, or Police Officers in training areas.
4. Harvesting forest products while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
5. Participating in harvesting of forest products in an impact area, range or other restricted area without authorization.
6. Loan or transfer of forest products harvesting permit to another.
7. Entering posted dud areas.
8. Taking or attempting to take any protected wildlife species.
9. Harvesting forest products while privileges are suspended.
10. Unauthorized horseback riding on installation property.
